Wayne Patch, Chairman - Bus Industry Confederation, Australia

Wayne had considerable exposure to the bus industry during his 20 year career with the Queensland Government including leading the Government's team on the negotiation of the major passenger transport reforms of 1994. Wayne later moved from public service to take over the reins of a Queensland bus company. Wayne is now Director of Transit Australia Group (TAG). Wayne has served as President of the Queensland Bus Industry Council (QBIC) for 4 years and has been BIC Chairman since October 2011..



Philip Green, Australian High Commissioner to Singapore

Mr Green was appointed as Australia's High Commissioner in 2012 and previously served overseas as High Commissioner in South Africa and Kenya. Mr Green has also held a number of senior positions in Australia. He was Chief of Staff to Foreign Minister Kevin Rudd and previously served as Mr Rudd's International Adviser when he was Prime Minister.

09:20 Singapore's Land Transport Master Plan – Lessons for Australia

Transport elements in Singapore's Land Transport Plan include electronic road pricing (a form of congestion charging in central city areas), cycling networks and pathways, vehicle quota system (i.e. the auctioning of certificates of entitlement for vehicle ownership), taxis and a dense and integrated public transport system consisting of the mass rapid transit system and bus network.

The 2013 Singapore Land Transport Master Plan works towards a vision of a "People-Centred Land Transport System", focussing on three key areas:

- More Connections
- Better Service
- Liveable and Inclusive Community
